A. INAPEF INFUSE grant/board structure discussion -

Brian and Rene attending second half of this event and discussed how it affects our BEF board.

B. Log Cabin Homestead roof -

Roof is in need of repair. Slide was shared about the current condition. Discussion ensued for remedies. Four remedies were given: 1) Traditional cedar shakes (\$28K) – 10-15 years; 2) Synthetic Cedar Shakes (\$37,425) – 30-50 years; 3) Traditional Asphalt (\$20k) – 20-25 years; 4) Corrugated Metal (\$22K) – 40 years.

Discussion continued on pros/cons of the different roofing materials – there were views on both sides from concerns over authenticity of experience to practicality of what we can afford. No official remedy was given.

- C. 2020 2023 Strategic Plan review Important to continue to review and adjust as needed.

Worked with Parks Department; there were coupons for ice cream; the bus ventured into neighborhoods not near a library. Does the attendance warrant continuing the program in the future?
